



Presidential Pause on Grant, Loan, and Other Financial Assistance Programs

Please see the message below regarding the order issued by the President. I will keep you updated as we learn more.

Last night, the Trump Administration issued a temporary pause on grant, loan, and other financial assistance programs to align them with Presidential priorities. The [order](#) covers “all Federal financial assistance programs” as defined in [2 CFR 200.1](#), but “does not include assistance provided directly to individuals.”

NADCO is actively working with SBA leadership and our colleagues on Capitol Hill to ascertain how this temporary pause might impact SBA loan programs and the small businesses served by the CDC industry.

The suspension goes into effect on January 28, 2025 (today), at 5pm eastern time. All Federal agencies have until February 10, 2025, to submit detailed information to OMB on any programs, projects or activities subject to this pause.
